Surveys and Consultations

Planning for planning Community groups and anyone else interested in development planning are being encouraged to respond to a Scottish Government consultation on a draft framework to inform day to day decision making in the planning system. When adopted (planned for summer 2022) NPF4 will have the status of the development plan for planning purposes. This means that its policies should inform day to day decision making in the planning system. It will also guide local development plans and will be relevant to regional spatial strategies and important for communities as they develop their Local Place Plans. Draft NPF4 is now subject to Parliamentary scrutiny for up to 120 days and the Scottish Government is inviting representations until 31 March 2022. The fund has been established by Old Luce Community Council, with the aspiration that all of the funds benefitting the Old Luce area can be administered through this single structure. Dumfries and Galloway Council's Community Led Economic Regeneration Fund (CLERF) aims to provide grant funding to community led organisations so they can plan and develop economic and place-based capital regeneration projects that are locally led and have a strong fit with local needs and ambitions.

What's the aim? The purpose of the fund is to support the development of capital projects that will drive community led inclusive economic regeneration and growth and will transform our region's towns and neighbourhood places.

The aim of the CLERF is to assist community led organisations to fund the technical support they need - from professional architects, quantity surveyors, engineers, specialist technical surveys and reports etc. - to assess the technical feasibility of their project idea, and to progress their project through subsequent design stages. Applications are welcomed from community led not-for-profit groups and organisations within Dumfries & Galloway who must be formally constituted, with a clear governance and financial structure and have their own bank account. Dumfries and Galloway Regional Arts Fund THIS FUND IS NOW OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS. The purpose of this fund is to increase the number of high quality arts projects for public and economic benefit of Dumfries and Galloway. For 2022/23 there was a total of £50,000 available and successful applicants needed to demonstrate how their project would deliver at least one of the following outcomes: **Outcome 1 – Connecting** Arts organisations, venues and creative producers across all art forms have more opportunities to share and tour their products across Dumfries and Galloway and beyond. **Outcome 2 – Collaboration** Arts organisations (and individual creative practitioners associated with them) have more opportunities to make new partnerships, or strengthen existing ones, with other organisations from other creative disciplines or with other professional sectors e.g. health, young people, heritage. Who can apply Constituted Third Sector, community or voluntary groups, registered charities and social enterprises who meet the funding criteria can apply for project funding. This fund doesn't support individual artist led projects. Business Ventilation Fund [Coronavirus in Scotland, Business, industry and innovation](#) Applications for £25 million fund to open. A £25 million fund to improve ventilation in business premises and reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission will open for applications next week. Small and medium-sized businesses such as restaurants, bars and gyms will be able to claim back costs of up to £2,500 to undertake work such as the installation of carbon dioxide monitors and remedial improvement work to windows and vents. Businesses will be able to fill in a self-assessment form to receive advice on improving their current ventilation systems and identify if they are eligible for financial support from their local authority. Effective ventilation is a key public health measure to reduce the risk of COVID-19 spreading and is of increasing importance during autumn and winter as people spend more time indoors. The Investing in Communities Fund (ICF), is anticipated to open for a second round of applications in spring next year. The fund aims to support community anchor organisations based in the places they serve by delivering activity across the following four areas for action in our most disadvantaged and fragile communities across Scotland: • tackling poverty and inequality; • sustaining place-based approaches; • community-led regeneration; • ensuring a just transition to net zero. The team which delivers the fund will be holding webinar sessions for interested stakeholders and prospective applicants to provide an overview of the fund's aims, eligibility criteria and the application process prior to its anticipated opening for applications next calendar year. The webinars will also include time for Q&A. The approach is also intended to provide time for interested organisations to develop quality collaborative place based proposals in conjunction with local partner organisations. Carbon Innovation Fund launching 22 November The Co-op Foundation have launched a £3m Carbon Innovation Fund, funded through Co-op donations raised from the sale of compostable carrier bags in the UK and Co-op Foundation funds. The Foundation plans to award funding of between £75k and £100k to about 10 projects in year one. Eligible organisations include charities, social enterprises, co-operatives and local, regional and national governments worldwide.
